Dear Dr. Bernácer,

I have given two letters of introduction to your friends within the last week.

Hon. John J. Burns, eminent lawyer and former law professor at Harvard, formerly Judge of the High Court of New York, is going to Spain on vacation, with his wife. I have written him a letter to Professor Sebastian. Judge Burns and his wife are now at sea on the S. S. "Constitution".

He is legal adviser of many important corporations. You may later have occasion to study intensively the economic situation. Any light you can throw on the trend of the economy will be of great help to him.

Also I gave a letter to Dr. Carlos García Matute, an economist and scientist, who has very wide connections in Ibero America, and an office in New York. He is an expert on business cycle research. He and his wife are now in London and Paris, and will reach Madrid May 10.

I have still to thank you for your most suggestive letter of June 26, 1951. In the interval, I have moved from New York to this city, 344 miles west of New York on the northern shore of Seneca. I retain my membership in the Cosmos Club, and use it as an address. I go to Washington several times a month for conferences with the Venezuelan Embassy, and to Geneva for one or two days each week.

I hope before too long, again to go to Europe.
